<p>General provisions (apply to existing and new lighting): <b>0.2</b> footcandle limit at property boundary, upward or downward. Applies to, but not limited to, spotlights, floodlights, <b>pool</b> or landscape lighting or similar illuminating devices.</p>	<p>General provisions (apply to existing and new lighting): <b>0.5</b> footcandle limit at property boundary at grade. Applies to, but not limited to, spotlights, floodlights, <b>[not pool]</b> landscape lighting or similar illuminating devices. <b>High intensity lighting fully shielded</b> and cast downward to minimize glare.</p>
<p>General provisions apply to new construction: <b>0.2</b> footcandle limit at property boundary, upward or downward.</p>	<p>New construction: <b>0.5</b> footcandle limit at property boundary <i>at grade</i> . Exterior, not single family. Only parking areas limited to <b>0.2</b> footcandles.</p>
<p>Warm light less than <b>3000Kelvin</b> (not blue or white light like many LEDs) where possible.</p>	<p>Warm light less than <b>3500Kelvin</b> (not blue or white light like many LEDs) and color index less than 70. Exterior, not single family.</p>
<p>Definition of light trespass: any light that crosses from desired location to adjacent property (upward or downward). Light emitted is presumed to fall beyond the property line <b>if the lamp is visible</b>.</p>	<p><b>Definition of light trespass:</b> any light that shines <b>upward above horizontal plane</b> from desired location to adjacent property. <b>Visible light source not considered trespass.</b></p>
<p>Definitions omitted because they weren't used (but maybe should be used)</p>	<p>Added definitions: standard definitions for Color of light, shield, fully shielded. Need definition of high <b>intensity lighting and exterior new construction</b>.</p>

<p>Existing parking: Height of parking lot light poles <b>20ft</b> and top floor parking garage light poles <b>15</b> ft. Lights on building or parking garage shall <b>not extend above roof line of building or wall of garage</b>.</p>	<p>Existing parking lot and garage poles: <b>No limits</b> on heights. <b>May extend above roof line</b>. Eliminated all provisions for parking lot lighting and parking garage lighting for existing structures.</p>
<p>Non-residential new <i>construction</i>: Height of parking lot light poles <b>15ft</b> and top floor parking garage light poles 15 ft</p>	<p>Non-residential new construction: Height of parking lot light poles <b>20ft</b> and top floor parking garage light poles 15 ft</p>

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Light reduction after hours (30 minutes after closing): <b>25%</b> of operating hours. Motion sensors may brighten them again for 5 minutes after activation ceases. Exemptions for stairs, walkways, entrances, 24 hr businesses, et al.	Light reduction after hours (30 minutes after closing): <b>75%</b> of operating hours. Motion sensors may brighten them again for 5 minutes after activation ceases. Exemptions for stairs, walkways, entrances, 24 hr businesses, et al.
<b>45</b> days allowed for holiday lighting (should define carnival lighting?)	<b>60</b> days allowed for holiday lighting
Any change in fixture or light source requires change permit (whether newly permitted or existing).	<b>Only change in light fixture or light source that was permitted</b> under this code requires change request. Existing light exempted.
<b>City of Houston</b> new buffering: parking garage screening next to residential or across street from residential: <b>48</b> inches unless demonstrated need for ventilation; otherwise 42 inches. 0.2 footcandle limit at property line (any direction)	New construction: Parking Garage Screening next to residential. <b>42</b> inches and shielding for ramps . Additional screening if light trespass [see definition: upward only] beyond the property line exceeds <b>0.2</b> footcandles, measured at grade.
City <b>not</b> exempted from following its own code	City exempted from requirements
